

Job Title: Graphic Design Intern- Exhibit Focus
Part-Time Position: Approximately 12-15 hrs/week
(Some weekend hours required)

Internship duties:

- 1. Create exhibit-wide graphic standards and logos that can be used on signage, labels, environmental treatments, promotional material, etc.
- 2. Create, prototype, and refine attractive and interesting exhibit graphics that make an exhibit easy to use, and present complicated information in an easy-to-understand manner.
- 3. Assist with the creation and distribution of exhibit promotional materials
- 4. Prepare graphics for print and complete other tasks necessary for graphics production.
- 5. Other duties as assigned by Direct Supervisor.

Qualifications

The ideal candidate will possess the following:

- 1. Thorough understanding of and experience with Adobe Creative Suiteespecially Photoshop, Illustrator, and InDesign
- 2. Creative thinking that is not confined by a rectangular piece of paper
- 3. Inquisitive nature, creative drive, willingness to take to feedback, and desire to learn
